






### Rector's Invitation

During Lent, a time of reflection, repentance, and preparation for the joy of Easter, we are offering the Alpha Course, a six-week exploration of the Christian faith, designed for those who are inquiring about the faith, new to the faith, or returning after some time away.



### What is the Alpha Course?

Alpha is a series of interactive sessions exploring the basics of the Christian faith. Each session includes a thought-provoking talk and an open discussion where questions are not only welcomed but encouraged. It's a safe and welcoming space where people can explore the Christian faith in a relaxed and non-judgmental environment.

Over 6 weeks, we'll cover the following topics:

- Is there more to life than this?
- Who is Jesus?
- Why did Jesus die?
- How can I have faith?
- Why and how do I pray?
- Why and how should I read the bible?

### Who is Alpha for?

If you are:

- Wondering about the meaning of life,
- Curious about Christianity,
- New to the faith and seeking a solid foundation,
- Returning to the faith after some time away,

... then Alpha is for you!

The Alpha Course will take place every Sunday evening during Lent, starting on 18th Feb, from 4:30pm. We will gather at St James' Church and each session will include a ploughman's supper.



### Open Doors' prayer for Sudan this month is:-

Encourage believers at this time, particularly those who are despondent, weary and hurt. Pour fresh hope into their hearts. Be a place of refuge for Your children, meet their every need and strengthen their faith. During this time of uncertainty and unrest, help our brothers and sisters to be beacons of light that draw others to You. Amen". **THE STOREHOUSE FOODBANK:** The food bank continues to be extremely busy, and consequently they are running very short of a lot of the items that are regularly given to clients.

Currently they need: tinned vegetables, tinned meals such as chilli, meatballs, stew, chicken in white sauce, curries. Also tinned pasta meals e.g. ravioli, macaroni cheese, spaghetti hoops etc. For people with limited cooking facilities instant pot noodles, and microwave rice are useful, also spreads that can go on bread or toast such as marmite, peanut butter, chocolate spread, honey and jam. Squash, coffee, sugar, and UHT milk are also items that are also frequently needed and consequently in short supply.

Please ensure that the tops of any liquid products placed in the donation box are tightly screwed on, as recently a bottle had leaked in the box and sadly spoilt some of the donations. Thank you for your continuous support of this important work. Ann Cook
