Rector's Reflection

2025 marks a remarkable anniversary. It's 1700 years since the Council of Nicaea (325 AD), where the *Nicene Creed* was written. Well, almost. The form we recite on communion Sundays is actually the revised edition

from 381, which is also known as the *Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed*. Even so, its roots lie in that first gathering of bishops called together by the Emperor Constantine to settle one of the biggest theological disputes of the early Church.

The question at the heart of that debate was this: Who is Jesus Christ in relation to God the Father?

Some argued that the Son was created by the Father and therefore not eternal, not equal with God. The bishops at Nicaea insisted otherwise. They affirmed that the Son is fully divine. He is "God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God." He is not less than God, he is of the same being as the Father.

Why does that matter? Because it's about the very nature of our Triune God. The Creed encapsulates what Holy Scripture reveals about who God is. And because to say the Creed is to join our voices with generations of Christians who have confessed this truth together. It keeps us rooted in faith and united with the wider Church across time and space.



So next time you say those ancient words in worship, remember what they mean. And remember the long line of believers who have said them before you:

"We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made."


CHURCH PRAYER MEETING




Advent Communion Service
