Rector's Reflection

When I was 14, I was airlifted to hospital. It happened during a Duke of Edinburgh trip in the Quantock Hills.

Our group was walking at the base of some cliffs when, in a freak accident, a rock was dislodged from above and came crashing

down-straight onto my head. I was badly injured and needed a rescue helicopter.

Whenever I tell this story, people often look at me in disbelief. "Really?" they ask. "Yes-look," I say, "here are the scars."

After Jesus rose from the dead, he gave his disciples many convincing proofs that he was truly alive.

"Look at me," he said. "Touch me. Listen to me."

They needed to know it was real. Because if the resurrection was true, then everything changed. Fear was replaced with hope. Doubt gave way to certainty. And in the face of suffering, even death itself, they had nothing to fear.

The same is true for us. The resurrection changes everything. It rescues us from our greatest danger. It means that Christians can say, in the words of the apostle Paul,

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting" (1 Corinthians 15:55)

Rejoice afresh in the resurrection this Easter!




The foodbank continues to be extremely busy, especially as people are still struggling with the cost of living.

With the approaching Easter holidays, some families are going to have increasing food worries as the children will not be receiving a school dinner for over two weeks.

Currently the need is for UHT milk, full fat and semi-skimmed, sugar and coffee. Tinned fruit, custard, rice pudding and individual jelly pots. Tinned meat such as corned beef, spam, ham as well as tinned meat meals, such as chilli con carne, chicken in white sauce, chicken stew etc. Riceboil in the baq or microwave rice is particularly useful. Spreads e.g. peanut butter, marmite, chocolate spreads and jam to go on bread or toast.

Bible Society, working both internationally as well as in the UK, continues to translate the Bible to make it accessible in people's heart languages. Through representatives worldwide, the Bible is brought into public spaces where its voice can be heard, and its stories told with the purpose of encouraging people who've never thought the Bible was for them to explore it for themselves. In the UK many people don't think the Bible is relevant to them, but Bible Society is determined to change that. In many other parts of the world, the key barrier to people engaging with the Bible is availability.

Bible Society's resources are aimed to help local churches engage more deeply with Scripture, including the work and ministry of Open the Book which aims to share Bible stories in primary schools with a generation almost entirely unfamiliar with them. Bible Society states that hundreds of incredible volunteers and creative storytelling teams have shared ageless Bible stories in thousands of primary schools. They have created lasting memories, sparked the imagination, given hope, taught important lessons, connected generations and touched the hearts of countless young people and their teachers. We are so grateful to them.

Open the Book turns 25 in 2025. Fiona, a member of the Open the Book staff team at Bible Society, says: "Jesus was a master storyteller, and his stories have greatly impacted my life, since I was a child. It is a huge privilege to be involved with Open the Book and pass my love of the Bible on".

St James' Open the Book Team takes Bible Stories into the primary schools on a regular basis in both Trowbridge and Keevil. The commitment of each member of our team is paramount to the success of sharing God's word in such meaningful and powerful ways.

PRAYER POINT: Please pray that Open the Book continues to flourish, to sow seeds of faith in young lives and to share these important, timeless stories over the next twenty-five years, even as the landscape of our world changes. Pray too for energy and protection of the St James' team in this important ministry.


