Rector's Reflection

Christian Unity



"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

- John 17:20-23

In John 17:20-23, Jesus prays for all his disciples. Specifically, he prays for their unity with one another. However, it's crucial to grasp the nature of this unity. It's not a human construct or built on our own terms. It is a unity devised and defined by God. The prayer highlights how the unity of the church is attained through Christ, given so that we share in Christ's glory, and purposely designed to display the eternal love of God before a watching world. In fact, the staggering assertion in Jesus' prayer is that our unity with one another reflects the perfect oneness in God, the Holy Trinity. Insert "mind blown" emoji here.

So, Christian unity is an imperative. It is always something we should pursue. Yet, Christian unity is not unity-on-our-terms or unity-at-all-costs. It's indelibly tied to Christ and the truth in him. May Christ's prayer for unity serve as our guide for navigating the complexities of unity within our parish and the wider Church of England.

OUR CHARITY FOCUS FOR APRIL IS BIBLE SOCIETY In 1804, The British and Foreign Bible Society, as it was then known, was founded following fifteen-year-old Mary Jones' 25 mile walk alone through some very wild Welsh countryside to Bala in 1802, to buy a Bible from a

Welsh minister, the Revd Thomas Charles. So moved by her

determination, he sold Mary three Bibles for the price of one. Mary's long walk for a Bible also inspired The Revd Joseph Hughes, another Welsh minister, who by then was very aware of the need for affordable Bibles in Wales. He said "if there is a need for Bibles for Wales, then why not for the kingdom? And if for the kingdom, why not for the world?" Captured by this vision of the Bible being available for everyone, the MP William Wilberforce attended a meeting in London on 7 March 1804 when the British and Foreign Bible Society was formed. Now known as Bible Society, its headquarters are in Swindon.

Bible Society's vision is for the Bible to shape the lives and communities of people everywhere. Their staff have translated the Bible into nearly every language in the world, and they provide many resources for use nationally and internationally, including materials for Open the Book that our OtB team use in our local schools.

The first meeting of the Trowbridge Action Group for Bible Society was in 1814, when the then Rector of St James', George Crabbe, (also a poet and surgeon), was the Secretary and Charles Bythesea, Rector of Freshford was President. The present Trowbridge Action Group continues to be made up of representatives from the local Churches, with the purpose of arranging fund-raising events to support Bible Society's national and international ministry. These include coffee mornings, churchyard sales and quizzes. Information about the events is in our monthly newsletters. The next event is a coffee morning on **Saturday April 20th**, **10am -12 noon at Wesley Road Methodist Church**. All are welcome to attend.

Prayer Point: Bible Society asks us to pray that all their planning and acting is guided and empowered by God's Spirit so that their vision will become reality. Please pray too for our Open the Book team as they go into schools to share God's word through story telling. THE STOREHOUSE FOODBANK: The foodbank continues to be extremely busy, especially as people are still struggling with the cost of living. With the approaching Easter holidays, some families are going to have increasing food worries as the children will not be receiving a school dinner for over two weeks.



Currently the need is for UHT milk, full fat and semi-skimmed, sugar and coffee. Tinned fruit, custard, rice pudding and individual jelly pots. Tinned meat such as corned beef, spam, ham as well as tinned meat meals, such as chilli con carne, chicken in white sauce, chicken stew etc. Rice- boil in the bag or microwave rice is particularly useful. Spreads e.g. peanut butter, marmite, chocolate spreads and jam to go on bread or toast. Thank you for your continued and generous support of this vital service. Ann Cook

Cosmos Petal

A personal Testimony by Mandy who was baptised at StJames' on Easter Sunday



I have never met you all, but I hope this story will make you wonder about life. A grand statement to make, but only because this flower has changed my life and I wish you the same happiness.

Isaiah 58:11 The Lord will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sunscorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail.

Imagine a bright, sunny morning in July. All is fresh and new, all you can hear are the birds, no one is awake yet. The world is calm, warm, welcoming. Walking around my garden I see the Cosmos flowers have bloomed, a shocking pink which grabbed my attention, so perfect, each petal tissue thin, dancing in the early morning breeze.

Time seemed to stand still, only one person could make something this perfect and it wasn't man. Cosmos flowers have eight petals, this realisation for me was marked by petal number one.

Life had not been kind in my early years. I was harmed by my father. I told my family, but it was all hushed up, seemingly easier to ignore it than to respond. I was angry at God. How could He let this happen? Where was He? How was I supposed to live with all this? Why would God love a person like me?

Petal number two marked a phone call. Surely such a beautiful flower could only have been created by God. For all of man's achievements a beauty so sublime was not man's creation. A feeling came over me that this phone call, if I had the faith to make it, could be life changing, maybe.

I spoke to Jake on the phone that day, we met and at once I felt peace, I was in the right place at the right time. Jake listened patiently and suggested it may be good to meet with his wife Nicola, who was embarking on a journey of offering Soul Care. A way to relate to the world through faith, with God's help.

Petal number three marked my meeting with Nicola, the beginning of my journey to faith. We trod gently, little by little. Step by step. My husband is very ill, I could use lots of medical words, but cancer seems to suffice in most people's minds. My heart wanted to connect with God, it was ready to, but how? My mind felt lost, unsure but strangely guided towards faith.

Petal number four marked faith. Nicola guided me gently, how to read the bible, where to look. Not how to understand it as I feel we all understand the bible in

different ways, but to guide me on the many ways it can be understood. A whole new world opened up for me.

Petal number five marked confidence. Not only in the words of the bible, but in Nicola and in myself. As I shared my childhood with Nicola and my journey with cancer, my life with my husband, life suddenly made sense. The Bible and Nicola's words were like a warm blanket, I had felt so cold for so long. It was like coming home. I would never be alone again. Whatever the future holds.

Matthew 6:28-34 ²⁸ "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. ³⁴ Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Petal number six marked work. Not hard work, nothing about this is hard. Nothing is negative, this is Church Work as I call it. Looking at life with a whole different perspective. A handing over of worries to God, faith in Him to guide me. Faith that no matter what He will be with me. A faith that everything is working out as it should do even when I wish it were different. The key to this for me is self-discipline, daily prayer, daily faith, deep breaths. Not really work at all, a labour of faith, the best kind of labour.

Petal number seven will be my baptism. A goal I am working towards. One that will come at exactly the right time. One which will mark my journey, one which I will be proud of. A goal which will be reached through love, hope and faith in God.

So, to Petal number eight. Well, this petal has not been marked and may never be marked. Cosmos flowers symbolise order, harmony, peace and balance. The Victorians also believed Cosmos flowers symbolised joy in love and life.

For me this means ongoing Church Work, and seeing these petals with hope in my heart. A life long journey of love. Joy and love in life is ongoing, so is faith, that's how I view my journey in life.

Isaiah 41:10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand

When the cosmos flowers bloom this year, maybe you might view your journey this way too. x


